The Office of Thesis and Dissertation Services is a unit of the Graduate College that develops supportive services for graduate students completing theses and dissertations.

We provide training and support for faculty, students, and staff involved in graduate education.

We also process, review, and approve proposals and completed theses and dissertations by assessing issues of conformity to the standards of the appropriate style manual and by reviewing issues of research design, data analysis, and research ethics.

Among our resources for graduate faculty and their students are the Dissertation Timeline and the Thesis Timeline. The [Dissertation Timeline](#) was created to help students navigate the many steps and challenges inherent in earning a doctoral degree. The timeline is made up of embedded links that lead to information concerning required actions, required forms, and their distribution that are part of the obligations of a doctoral student. A comparable [Thesis Timeline](#) is also now published for Master's students in thesis-option graduate programs.

One of the new "services" available to faculty is the use of [iThenticate](#). This is a product from the same folks who gave us Turnitin. However, unlike Turnitin, iThenticate does not retain submissions. Its use is to inform students and faculty members about the amount of "unoriginal" content in their writings, thereby avoiding charges of plagiarism.
