- <u>Course Description</u>: This course focuses on legal principles governing criminal law including culpability/mental state, defenses to criminal responsibility, punishments, offenses against persons and property, offenses against public order and decency, offenses against public health safety and morals, organized crime, and drug offenses. Additionally, the course will focus on criminal procedure principles including courts and criminal jurisdiction, habeas corpus, venue, arrests with/without warrants, search warrants, 4<sup>th</sup> amendment search and seizure issues, bail, grand jury proceedings, and indictments/informations.
- <u>Course Objectives/Goals</u>: To give students a basic overview of criminal law and procedure and to expose students to the role and ethical obligations of Judges, Courts, Prosecutors, Defense Attorneys, and Peace Officers. Students should be able to demonstrate comprehension/understanding of these areas through class room discussion and test results. Students will also research legal issues/cases to be presented by the instructor then draft office briefs/memos concerning the issue.
