- c. Bibliography and Footnotes. Please cite all sources in a bibliography and footnotes using the Chicago Style Manual as found in *A Manual for Writers of Term Papers, Theses, and Dissertations* by Kate Turabian or www.chicagomanualofstyle.org.
- d. The paper is due on the last class day, July 1st. Each student will present an oral presentation to the class over the content of the paper.
