Course Description (1 credit hour)

This course presents critical thinking and problem-solving strategies for evaluating ethical and legal frameworks for intellectual property, safety, and quality in nursing and related fields.

Student Learning Outcomes:

At the end of this course, the student will be able to:

1. Use critical thinking and problem-solving strategies for evaluating ethical and legal frameworks for intellectual property.

2. Apply concepts of ethical and legal frameworks for safety and quality in nursing and related fields.
3. Demonstrate responsibility for own learning at levels consistent with student nurses' role and professional expectations.

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Instructional / Methods / Activities Assessments

This is an online course without lecture requiring students to complete online activities and independent study to be successful. Course objectives may be met through individual study using suggested resources, formal, and informal exchange of ideas with classmates and colleagues regarding specific topics as well as utilizing critical thinking skills. Teaching methods include discussion, independent study of texts and library resources, computer-assisted instruction, audio-visual aids, and the assignments listed. While the professor will provide guidance and consultation, the student is responsible for identification of learning needs, self-direction, seeking consultation and demonstration of course objectives.

Late Submissions

It is expected that you will submit all assignments on time. If you need an extension, it should be requested before the due date and may or may not be approved at the discretion of the course coordinator. Unexcused late assignments will be penalized 10% per day for each of the first two days overdue; on the 3rd day, the grade will be assigned as 0%. Paper submissions

All documents submitted online are to be in .docx, .rtf or .pdf format. No other formats will be accepted (JPEG, GIF, etc.). Assignments need to be submitted in a maximum of one document per assignment. Failure to follow these guidelines will result in a grade of "0" on the assignment.

TECHNOLOGY REQUIREMENTS

 - 512 MB of RAM, 1 GB or more preferred
 - Broadband connection required courses are heavily video intensive
 - Video display capable of high-color 16-bit display 1024 x 768 or higher resolution
- You must have a:
 - sound card, which is usually integrated into your desktop or laptop computer
 - speakers or headphones.
- Depending on your course, you might also need a:
 - webcam
 - microphone

For courses where interactive tools are used, like VoiceThread or Class Live Pro, headphones are suggested for use with recording and playback. We recommend a webcam with an integrated microphone, such as the

Microsoft LifeCam Cinema. All devices should be installed and configured before class begins.

- Both versions of Java (32 bit and 64 bit) must be installed and up to date on your machine. Java can be downloaded at:

- Current anti-virus software must be installed and kept up to date.
- You will need some additional free software for enhanced web browsing. Ensure that you download the free versions of the following software:
 - Adobe Reader
 - Adobe Flash Player
- At a minimum, you must have Microsoft Office 2013, 2010, 2007 or Open Office. Microsoft Office is the standard office productivity software utilized by faculty, students, and staff. Microsoft Word is the standard word processing software, Microsoft Excel is the standard spreadsheet software, and Microsoft PowerPoint is the standard presentation software. Copying and pasting, along with attaching/uploading documents for assignment submission, will also be required. If you do not have Microsoft Office, you can check with the bookstore to see if they have any student copies.

1. Nursing Students Article Assignment 6/17

Obtain three (3) recent (last 5 years) articles regarding nursing students and plagiarism. Research articles are preferred but not required. Submit a pdf of each article along with a reference page in APA format. No title page is required for this assignment.

2. Resource Evaluation Paper 7/8

Identify three (3) resources either print or online regarding plagiarism. These resources cannot be journal articles. Write a two-three page paper in APA format discussing what you learned from each of the resources. A title page and reference page in APA format is required for this assignment.

3. Quality & Safety in Nursing Paper 7/22

Write a two-three page paper in APA format on issues learned about quality and safety in nursing. Discuss the implications on professionalism and patient care when these concepts are not addressed in practice. A title page and reference page in APA format is required for this assignment.

4. Issues with Plagiarism Paper 8/5

Write a three-four page paper in APA format regarding the impact of plagiarism on a personal, university, profession, and society level. A title page and reference page in APA format is required for this assignment.
