Macroeconomic theory involves the use of models to explain and determine economy-wide variables such as income, output, unemployment, growth, inflation. Macroeconomic policy examines how these aggregates are affected by the changes in the government policies such as changes in the government spending, taxes, etc. I will try to accomplish my objectives through a blend of reading, lecture, homework assignments, exams and your participation in the class discussions.

Good study habits for this course require you to sit down with pen or pencil in hand and work through the models. Systematic study, rather than cramming, is advisable. <u>Attending the lectures</u>, <u>reading the assigned materials</u>, <u>working the assigned exercises</u>, <u>taking notes in class</u>, and using the office hours are important learning tools.
