# **Course Description**

This course looks at the place where theatre, social issues and business meet. We will explore the spirit of board governance as well as the "nuts and bolts" of effective board operations. Questions such as, "How to balance the aesthetic mission with the needs of the marketplace." "By defining arts entrepreneurship, are we able to show the synergies between art, entertainment and business?" "Who am I as an artist?" "What can art do?" "Why do matters of freedom, justice and equality matter to arts leaders?" "How can I as an artist driven leader promote social change?" "How can we make the arts as important to the national psyche as sports?"

- 1. To understand the larger context in which board trustees, managers and artists govern non profit organizations.
- 2. To understand the performing arts as a mode of social and cultural exchange that can empower individuals and communities.
- 3. To provide an exploration of arts entrepreneurship and management issues and practices to inspire greater understanding and interest in the field.
- 4. To recognize and develop opportunities in an arts related venture.
- 5. Recognize the synergies between art, entertainment and business.

# **TECHNOLOGY REQUIREMENTS**

# Pearson LearningStudio (eCollege) Access and Log in Information

This course will be facilitated using Pearson LearningStudio, the learning management system used by Texas A&M University-Commerce. # **LearningStudio Notifications**
