Course Description

Hours: 2

Concentrates on legal, ethical, economic and political issues affecting the nurse as an individual and a professional, and health care delivery to clients, groups and aggregates. Consideration is

given to self-discovery, personal assertiveness, role conflict, negotiation and collective bargaining. Students are encouraged to apply critical thinking strategies during classroom discussions and presentations.

Instructional Methods

This course consists of a series of activities and assessments to assist students in achieving the learning outcomes for the course. Each week students will complete various combinations of assignments, discussions, activities, and readings. Instructional strategies may include, but are not limited to: lecture, discussion, presentations, quizzes, media resources (YouTube and others), audio-visual aids, and group activities. This course meets face to face every other week.

Student Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students will have been given the opportunity to:

- 1. Discuss historical and contemporary issues in nursing and their impact on current nursing practice.
- 2. Describe state and national statutes, rules, and regulations that authorize and define professional nursing practice.
- 3. Debate moral/ethical/legal issues that impact nursing practice and the health care delivery system.
- 4. Discuss the implications of healthcare policy on issues of access, equity, affordability, and social justice in healthcare delivery.
- 5. Compare and contrast the roles and perspectives of the nursing profession with other care professionals on the healthcare team, such as scope of discipline, education, and licensure requirements.
- 6. Articulate the value of the pursuit of practice excellence and lifelong learning.

COURSE POLICIES AND PROCEDURES

Student Responsibilities

Attendance:

Students are expected to attend all scheduled classes. Absences may cause the student to be unable to meet course objectives and can affect grades. Tardiness will not be tolerated unless prior notification of instructor is made. Class attendance is mandated by current Nursing Program policy. Please refer to the *BSN Nursing Student Guide*.

Preparation:

Students are responsible for reading and completing assignments and for being prepared to participate in discussions over the assigned material. It should not be expected that all material will be covered in class. Students are expected to come prepared to any course event/meeting.

Course Activities:

Course activities, including assignments, papers, and quizzes, must be completed on time. Any required activity submitted late without prior arrangement with course faculty will receive a zero. Students unable to meet the learning activity/assignment on the date due must arrange for make-up with the instructor prior to the original due date. Otherwise, a grade of zero will be earned for the assignment.

All documents submitted online are to be in .docx, .rtf or .pdf format. No other formats will be accepted (JPEG, GIF, etc.). Assignments need to be submitted in a maximum of one document per assignment. Failure to follow these guidelines will result in a grade of 0 on the assignment.

In the event that a class is canceled, students are expected to complete the readings and objectives for that day.

Syllabus:

The material in this syllabus and dates identified in the Course Calendar are subject to change. The syllabus is a guide. Circumstances and events, such as student progress, may make it necessary for the instructor to modify the syllabus during the semester. Any changes made to the syllabus will be announced in advance.

Classroom Etiquette:

The use of electronic devices, including laptops, iPads, and voice recorders, must be approved by the course faculty prior to class. Laptops not being used to take notes should be closed. Social media activity will not be allowed during class time. *Faculty may not be recorded, filmed, or taped without permission*. Cellular telephones will not be allowed in class.

Minimal Technical Skills:

Skills required for this course include the ability to use the learning management system, Microsoft Word, and Microsoft PowerPoint.

Interaction with the Instructor:

Communication between faculty and students is important and taken seriously. It is expected that students check the D2L course and related email frequently for communication from the instructor. Faculty are committed to student success in this course. Students are responsible for making appointments and asking questions to clarify any questions or procedures. The preferred communication method is via email or individualized office hours. In corresponding via email with faculty, allow two business days for a response. You will be treated with collegial respect and you are expected to communicate likewise in a professional manner.

Assessments

Ouizzes:

Online quizzes over assigned readings will be due by 2359 the night before each on-campus class.

Disciplinary Action Paper:

Complete a 4-5 page paper on the disciplinary action taken by the Texas Board of Nursing on your assigned Registered Nurse. Use correct APA format for all elements within the paper. The Grading Rubric provided within the course should be used as a guide for preparation of the paper.

Professional Issues Presentation (Group):

Students will be divided into small groups and assigned a topic to present to the class. Groups will be pre-assigned, and topics and presentation dates will be determined by lottery drawing. Group participants will meet (face-to-face or virtual) outside class to develop their presentations. A discussion group within the course is available for communication among group members regarding the presentation. Presentations should be approximately 20-25 minutes in length. The Grading Rubric provided within the course should be used as a guide for preparation of the presentation.

Professional Issues Presentation References (Individual):

^{*}A minimum grade of 75 is required to pass this course.

Each individual student with the presentation group is required to select two (2) journal references concerning the assigned group topic to be shared with the class. Citations must be in correct APA format and include 3-4 sentences describing what can be found in the article and its value to understanding the issue. There should be no duplication within the group. References are due at the time of the presentation.

Professional Issues Presentation Group Member Peer Participation Evaluation:

Each student will complete a participation evaluation on all the members of the group. Evaluations for each group member are due at the time of the presentation.

HIPAA/Social Media Paper:

Complete a 3 page paper on the use of social media and HIPAA violations. Use correct APA format for all elements within the paper. The Grading Rubric provided within the course should be used as a guide for preparation of the paper.
