## **COURSE INFORMATION**

Required Materials

<u>The Elephant Man</u> by Bernard Pomerance (play script – <u>not</u> film script) Various monologues chosen by the student

**Required Viewing:** The Elephant Man directed by David Lynch (1980 film)

**Technology requirements:** You will need to have a laptop or similar device and be able to access the internet. Students will also need to be able to video themselves at least twice during the semester.

**Course Description:** This is an exploratory course of the fundamentals of theatre production and will incorporate a brief overview of theatre history, script analysis, theatrical design, and other elements of theatrical production. Students will experience dramatic literature in several formats, including close reading of play scripts and videos of live performances. Students will analyze and critique those experiences.

**Objective:** The primary purpose of this course is to create educated and engaged audience members. Students who have had a variety theatrical experiences will have a better appreciation for theatre and a better understanding of dramatic literature.

## **Standard Learning Outcomes:**

Critical Thinking-- Students will be able to analyze, evaluate, or solve problems when given a set of circumstances, data, texts, or art.

Communications-- In written, oral, and/or visual communication, A&M-Commerce students will communicate in a manner appropriate to audience and occasion, with an evident message and organizational structure.

Teamwork-- Students will be able to work together toward a shared purpose relevant to the course or discipline with a sense of shared responsibility for meeting that purpose.

Social Responsibility-- Students will demonstrate an understanding of societal and/or civic issues.

## **Student Learning Outcomes Specific to This Course:** By the end of this course, the student will be able to:

- 1. understand basic terminology used in theatre,
- 2. have a historical view of theatrical production,
- 3. intelligently discuss major theatrical movements,
- 4. experience designing costumes, hair and makeup, setting, and publicity for a play, and
- 5. create a virtual portfolio.

**Methodology:** This course will be taught and evaluated through online lessons, video examples of theatrical production, videos of live performances of theatrical production, virtual class discussions, written critiques/reviews, close script reading, various class assignments, midterm and final exams. - 5% Final exam 750-word essay your choice of topic from a provided list
