Course Description

This course concentrates on legal, ethical, economic and political issues affecting the nurse as an individual and a professional, and health care delivery to clients, groups and aggregates. Consideration is given to self-discovery, personal assertiveness, role conflict, negotiation and

collective bargaining. Students are encouraged to apply critical thinking strategies during classroom discussions and presentations.

Student Learning Outcomes

Upon completion of the course, students will be able to:

- 1. Discuss historical and contemporary issues in nursing and their impact on current nursing practice (AACN Essentials II, III, IV, VIII, IX).
- 2. Describe state and national statutes, rules, and regulations that authorize and define professional nursing practice (AACN Essential V, VIII).
- 3. Debate moral/ethical/legal issues that impact nursing practice and the health care delivery system (AACN Essentials IV, V, VIII).
- 4. Discuss the implications of healthcare policy on issues of access, equity, affordability, and social justice in healthcare delivery (AACN Essentials V, IX).
- 5. Compare and contrast the roles and perspectives of the nursing profession with other care professionals on the healthcare team, such as scope of discipline, education, and licensure requirements (AACN Essential VI).
- 6. Articulate the value of the pursuit of practice excellence and lifelong learning (AACN Essential III).

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Minimal Technical Skills Needed:

Using the learning management system; using Microsoft Word and PowerPoint.

Instructional Methods:

Course objectives may be met through individual study using suggested resources, active involvement in classroom activities, formal and informal exchange of ideas with classmates and colleagues regarding specific topics as well as utilizing critical thinking skills. Teaching methods include lecture, seminar, discussion, small group work, independent study of texts and library resources, computer-assisted instruction, audio-visual aids and the assignments listed. While the professor will provide guidance and consultation, the student is responsible for identification of learning needs, self-direction, seeking consultation and demonstration of course objectives.

- Logging into the course website daily during the week
- Checking emails at least daily
- Updated semester calendar with communicated changes

^{*}A minimum grade of 75 is required to pass the course. Students must also achieve an overall average of 75% on all written exams to pass the course.

Successful completion of required assignments will enable the student to meet the student learning outcomes.

Late Submissions

It is expected that students will submit all assignments on time. If an extension is needed, it should be requested <u>before</u> the due date/time and may or may not be approved at the discretion of the course coordinator. Unexcused late assignments will be penalized 10% per day for each of the first two days overdue; on the 3rd day, the grade will be assigned as 0%. Communication on these matters is the student's responsibility.

Paper Submissions

All documents submitted online are to be in .docx, .rtf, or .pdf format. No other formats will be accepted (JPEG, GIF, etc.). Assignments need to be submitted in a maximum of one document per assignment. Failure to follow these guidelines will result in a grade of "0" on the assignment.

ASSESSMENTS

Philosophy (Personal)

Due 1/17/2022 @2359 and Due 5/1/2022 @2359

Students will write a personal philosophy using questions from the philosophy rubric to discuss their beliefs, attitudes and values regarding nursing, the nursing profession (goals, roles, functions), persons (patients), environment, health and health outcomes, health care. excellence and lifelong learning. This paper will be submitted at the beginning of the semester and

reassessed at the end of the semester. Students will evaluate where they stand with their philosophy at the end of the semester. References are only required for the second paper. This assignment is intended to be the start of a life-long, professional review of attitudes, beliefs and values regarding key components of nursing practice and patient care. This activity addresses Student Learning Outcome #6.

Face-to-Face Class Pre-work and Participation (4 Pre-work Submissions)

The purpose of these assignments is for students to critically examine content provided in course assigned readings. Pre-work may consist of online quizzes, case studies, assignments or other information pertaining to the assigned content. Students will be required to complete assigned pre-work (available on D2L) and submit to D2L by 0800 the morning of the face-to-face class. Each student should be prepared to participate in presenting information to their peers for classroom discussion. If Pre-work is not submitted and/or the student is not in class (without prior arrangement), the student will receive a zero for the assessment. These activities address Student Learning Outcomes #1-6.

Online Class Post-work (11 Post-work Submissions)

The purpose of these assignment is for students to critically review content provided in online class meetings and course assigned readings. Post work submission is required after online class content is viewed and assigned chapter readings have been completed. Post-work may consist of online quizzes, case studies, assignments, discussion boards, or other information pertaining to the assigned content. Submission should be made via the course D2L by the Friday following class. If the Post-work is not submitted (without prior arrangement), the student will receive a zero for the assessment. These activities address Student Learning Outcomes #1-6.

Build-a-Nurse Presentation (Group):

Due 1/30/22 @2359

The purpose of this assignment is for students to gain an understanding of various nursing specialties, as well as their standards and issues within the nursing profession. Students will develop a Power point presentation with audio narration (10-15 minutes in length) that presents an assigned nursing specialty, a selected professional organization, the standards of the specialty, and the issues prevalent within the specialty. The presentation will be posted in the Build-a-Nurse Presentation area (for grading) as well as in the Build-a-Nurse Discussion Board (for viewing and comment by peers). Group members will be expected to moderate the discussion regarding their presented specialty. Other students not in the group are expected to view all of the presentations and individually participate at least three times in discussions unrelated to their own group's work. The related discussion board is a part of Post-work Week #3. These activities address Student Learning Outcomes #1-6.

Disciplinary Action Paper (Individual):

Due 2/27/2022@2359

The purpose of this activity is for the student to acquire an understanding of the Texas Nursing Practice Act and the impact and ramifications of individual nurse violations of the Act. Students will complete a paper on the disciplinary action taken by the Texas Board of Nursing on an assigned Registered Nurse. Each student will be assigned an appropriate resource for this assignment. The paper should be no more than five (5) pages in length, including the cover page and the reference page. The paper will be submitted via the D2L Assignments tab by the due date

on the course calendar. The rubric for evaluation of this paper is provided within this syllabus. This activity addresses Student Learning Outcomes #2 and #3.

HIPAA/Social Media Paper (Individual): Due4/04/2022 @2359

The purpose of this learning activity is for the student gain an understanding of the benefits, perils, and ethical/legal implications of the use of social media associated with one's own professional nursing career and the care of patients. Each student will complete a paper of at least six (6) and no more than seven (7) pages in length, including the cover page and the reference page. The paper will be submitted via the D2L Assignments tab by the due date on the course calendar. The rubric for evaluation is provided within this syllabus. This activity addresses Student Learning Outcomes #1, #2, #3, #4, and #6.

Nursing Theorist Presentation (Group) Due 4/26 or 5/03/2022 in class

Students will choose a nursing theorist and present history of the theorist; the nursing theory components; the relationship and relevance to professional nursing practice today and the implications of this theory on patient care and on health care outcomes and health care policy. In discussing relevance, the group will discuss its applicability in the current health care environment. Include the theorist's theory regarding each of the components you discussed in your philosophy. Students are expected to be creative in their approach. The chosen theorist must be submitted in writing to Dr. McKenzie by 0800 on Tuesday, January 25, 2022, This activity addresses Student Learning Outcomes #1 and #4.

Syllabus Change Policy:

*This syllabus is a guide. Circumstances and events, such as student progress, may make it necessary for the instructor to modify the syllabus during the semester. Any changes made to the syllabus will be announced in advance.

NURSING PROGRAM PROCEDURES

Interaction with Instructor, Communication, and Support:

It is expected that students will check the D2L course and email at least **DAILY** for communication from the instructor. A response will occur within two (2) business days. Communication between faculty and students is primary and taken seriously. Preferred communication methods are individualized office hours, email, or via cell phone. If a phone call is not answered, please leave a message and send an e-mail using the direct e-mail link on the course home page. Students will be treated with collegial respect and are expected to communicate likewise in a professional manner.

If you have any questions or are having difficulties with the course material, please contact your Instructor. Students are expected to adhere to the chain of command for any issues that need resolution, just as you would as a professional nurse.

It is expected that assignments will be graded and returned to the student within two weeks of submission.
