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### **Course Description:**

This course provides an overview of federal income tax laws and regulations. The course emphasizes the impact of federal income tax on the individual taxpayer.

#### Tax Project

There is 1 comprehensive tax project due at the end of the course. This assignment will require you to prepare a tax return for an individual. You may use the fillable forms that are provided within Connect (see Tax Forms Tab) in order to complete the projects o rcomplete them by hand. All supporting schedules and documentation should be attached to your project.

#### **Examinations**

Two exams will be given during the semester. The exams will cover specific chapters as we cover the material during the semester. The exams will be similar to the homework and problems assigned in class. There are **no** make-ups for the two exams. If you plan to miss an exam due to extenuating circumstances you must notify the professor prior to the exam to set up a time/date to take the exam.

Weekly live sessions will be offered using Zoom to go over important concepts and review problems related to various chapters.
