### **Course Description**

This course is intended for graduate students who wish to learn the application of rigorous computational methods and to implement them to concepts of finance studied in introductory and other advance finance courses using Microsoft Excel. The course provides students with the opportunity to develop the skills needed to build financial models. The course primarily focuses on models used for valuation, capital budgeting, cost of capital and portfolio models. This course is a hands-on, assignments-based course focusing on getting students to work with Excel to solve computational problems from a broader range of finance concepts.

## **Student Learning Outcomes**

At the conclusion of the course, the students will be able to:

1. demonstrate how to apply basic and advanced functions in Excel
2. use Excel to build models for financial, statistical and investment concepts.
3. implement portfolio optimization models to calculate efficient portfolios and the efficient frontier
