ORGANIZATION LEADERSHIP PROGRAM DESCRIPTION

The Bachelor of Applied Arts and Sciences in Organizational Leadership (ORGL) degree is a competency-based program that prepares innovative leaders for employment in an increasingly technological and global society. This program provides opportunities for students to receive credit for what they know and can do already, allows them to accelerate completion of their degree, and — because it is fully online — students are able to plan their study schedule around the rest of their day to complete the coursework.

COURSE DESCRIPTION

This competency course explores leadership's responsibility for conceiving, designing, implementing and managing the organization's overall objectives, culture, and environment as part of the project management process. Within this context, the course primarily focuses on understanding project management, aligning project management with the organization, project management oversight, projects as capital investments, globalization and resources optimization.

STUDENT LEARNING OUTCOMES

Completion of this course provides the student with the knowledge to:

1. Define key concepts of projects and project management
2. Describe the phases of a project
3. Identify challenges and formulate strategies for leading conflict resolution
4. Identify and describe, and apply various tools used in initiating and planning a project
5. Analyze risks associated with project execution
6. Explain the process of project implementation and describe how to close a project

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

ASSESSMENT

Course Pre-test

The purpose of the pre-test is to provide a baseline understanding of your knowledge in this competency. The pre-test is required before you begin studying course materials. The grade on the pre-test does NOT count in the final calculated grade for this course.

Course Unit Quizzes

Quiz completion allows you the opportunity to test your knowledge and identifies areas that you will need to revisit in preparation for the Post-Test. Rather than having just the Post-Test as your only grade, averaging the weekly quizzes with your Post-Test grade gives you more flexibility. Unit quizzes are timed quizzes. Once all the quizzes are taken, students need should contact the instructor to obtain the passcode for access to the Post-Test.

Course Post-test

The purpose of the Post-Test is to assess the student's knowledge and understanding of major concepts, theories, and processes in the course. Before taking the Post-Test, students need to contact the instructor to obtain the passcode for the Post-Test. A **score of 80% or higher** is required on the Post-Test to demonstrate competency. The Post-Test is a timed exam.

If you score less than 80% on the Post-Test, you will have an opportunity to review the material and retake the Post-Test two additional times. If the Post-Test score is less than 80% within three attempts, students will receive a grade of "F" in the course.
