Course Description

This course is intended for undergraduate students. This course provides the student with an understanding of the basic terminology, structure, and importance of real estate.

Course Learning Outcomes

After the course, the students will be able to:

- 1. Understand the nature of real estate markets.
- 2. Understand the time value of money and compute mortgage calculations using TVM techniques.
- 3. Understand legal concepts in real estate including property rights, deeds, and leases etc.
- 4. Understand different channels of home mortgage lending, major participants, and methods of funding.
- 5. Analyzing debt and financing scenarios and deciding between available mortgages.

Course Learning Outcomes 2, 4, and 5 address COB Student Learning Objective 5: Students will be analytical problem solvers in business environments.
