Course Description and Objectives

The Introduction to Business Finance course introduces students to financial management concepts. The course explores in detail the fundamental knowledge of business finance, time value of money, financial markets, financial instruments, capital budgeting, financial forecasting and valuation.

Upon satisfactory completion of this course, the student will be able to:

- Understand basic business finance concepts.
- Gain fundamental knowledge of financial markets and financial instruments.

Course Materials

- Textbook (strongly recommended but not required): Brigham and Houston, *Fundamentals of Financial Management*, Concise 9th edition.
- <u>Either</u> Texas Instruments BAII Plus financial calculator <u>OR</u> Laptop/Desktop with Microsoft (MS) Excel. I will teach you how to solve problems using both the financial calculator and MS Excel. You will have the choice to use either financial calculator or MS Excel. However, please note that MS Excel is a Microsoft product and works best with Microsoft Windows and I will be using MS Excel in Windows. If you are using a Mac iOS, there might be compatibility issues and it is your responsibility to troubleshoot Microsoft Excel in Mac iOS; otherwise, you should just use the Texas Instruments BAII Plus financial calculator.

This course will use the MyLeo (D2L Brightspace) course management system. If you are using a Mac iOS, you must download the Chrome app. However, the app does not fully quarantee your full accessibility.

Examinations

Exams will be primarily of an objective nature, e.g., problem solving, true-false, and multiple-choice. You must not discuss exam contents with any other person. You are on your honor to help preserve the integrity of the exam. Make-up exams will ONLY be considered under extenuating circumstances. Work, personal travel, etc. are NOT extenuating circumstances. Extenuating circumstances would include school sponsored excused event (communicated by faculty advisor/coach), hospitalization, medical emergency, physical injury, or death of an immediate family member. You will be required to provide proof of the extenuating circumstance to be approved for a make-up exam. Make-up exams for students attending school-sponsored events, are scheduled before event departure. Other approved makeups are scheduled within three days of approval of documented extenuating circumstances.

Project Assignment

There will be one project assignment given during the term. Details on the project will be discussed during the term. You are encouraged (NOT mandatory) to work in groups with a maximum of four members in each group. You are free to form your own group for the project assignment. There will be NO extension on the Project deadline.

Homework Chapter Quizzes

There will be several homework quizzes given during the term through D2L. Each homework quiz will typically cover a chapter and may include both conceptual and problem questions. You are allowed to use your textbook and class lecture materials during the homework quizzes; however, you must complete those on your own without anyone's help. Each homework quiz will have its deadline and there will be NO extension on the deadline.
