### **Course Description**

This course prepares pre-service teachers to effectively teach social studies in elementary classrooms (grades EC-6). Students will explore age-appropriate pedagogical approaches, instructional strategies, and assessment strategies specific to elementary social studies education.

### **Student Learning Outcomes**

*At the completion of the course, students should be able to:*

1. Implement a variety of instructional strategies appropriate for elementary social studies.
2. Integrate children's literature effectively into social studies instruction to increase student engagement.
3. Select and utilize primary sources suitable for elementary students.
4. Incorporate age-appropriate technology tools and digital resources to enrich social studies instruction in the elementary classroom.

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5. Design an engaging social studies lesson plans aligned to Elementary Social Studies TEKS.
