Course Description

We call it domestic violence. We call it private violence. Sometimes we call it intimate terrorism. But whatever we call it, we do not believe it has anything at all to do with us, despite the World Health Organization deeming it a "global epidemic." In America, domestic violence accounts for 15 percent of all violent crime, and yet it remains locked in silence, even as its tendrils reach unseen into so many of our most pressing national issues, from our economy to our education system, from mass shootings to mass incarceration to #MeToo. We still have not taken the true measure of this problem.

Research Paper: (20 points)

Each student will complete a research paper for the course. Topics will be chosen by the student from the topics covered in the text and given final approval by the course instructor. You may choose any topic if it is relevant to the course. At least (Five) outside sources must be used in the paper. It must be at least five written pages, plus a cover page and reference page, making it no less than seven pages. (APA STYLE) (DUE: April 6, 2025)
