Course Description

This course is designed to explore criminal and behavioral profiling, its context, and especially its causes. First, a foundation will be provided concerning the basic concepts of crime, behavior and how it correlates. Next, theories of crime causation will be explored. The etiology or causes of crime are at the heart of this course, with the theories acting as pillars in the class structure. Next, crime typologies will be examined, or the different kinds of crimes most prevalent in our society. Lastly, we will gain an overview of the criminal justice system itself. The intent of this format is to present a balanced perspective on the field of criminology for new students to the discipline. Attention will also be directed to assure inclusion of issues concerning race, gender, and class, which are often overlooked.

Instructional Methods

The method of instruction for this course will be a combination of power point presentations, discussions, and group activities. The specific activities used to engage students in mastering chapter material will be discussion board participation, exams and a research paper as assigned.

Assessments

Exams: You will have 9 exams during the course (each exam is worth 100 points). The exams, in general, will not be cumulative, however some of the material presented later in the course builds on topics previously discussed. Exams are to be taken during the week listed on the syllabus. Each examination will consist of short essay questions. You may prepare for these exams by reviewing reading assignments, class notes and discussion questions. Please know that a short essay is not 1-3 sentences. It is a well thought out answer in 2-3 good paragraphs. You should also cite any sources used to answer these questions. Each question is worth 25 points so make sure your answer is worth 25 points.

Online Discussions: We are going to integrate most of our learning into online discussion. Please, make sure you are familiar with all aspects of D2L. There is an online tutorial if there is something you do not understand. Not understanding D2L is not an acceptable excuse for late assignments. Start now getting familiar with it. For <u>full credit of 20 points</u>, you will need to post an original post that is cited correctly (APA) and answer TWO of your classmates with a reply which consists of more than "I agree or I disagree". There should be a total of THREE replies to each discussion board for full credit. There are 11 Online Discussions to complete for full credit in the course.

Research Project: The research project will be in the format of a PowerPoint due at the end of the semester. I would like you to create this PowerPoint based on one of the topics we discuss in this course. The idea is the topic you choose should be able to explain parts of criminological behavior and profiling. So, once you have chosen your topic, I want you to completely define the topic and explain how this topic fits into identifying behaviors and /or profiling. This PowerPoint must be at least 30 slides long not including your title slide and works cited slide(s). Please, use APA format writing style and for your works cited slides. You must use at LEAST 5 sources or works cited. Your work will be graded for grammar, spelling and content. You will have all semester to work on this project and if you have any questions, please ask. I am here to help you learn and have a positive learning experience. I want you to be creative using color and pictures. Please use examples to back up your topic. You can use anything to make this attention grabbing- have fun with this project, and just understand it is your final. You will have deadlines to meet throughout the course with reference to this project, so please be on the lookout for prompts on your syllabus. This will be your final exam as well and is worth 200 points of your final grade.

You are encouraged to monitor your grades throughout the semester via the grade book in D2L. If you turn in an assignment and do not receive a grade or have a question about the grading, I need to know immediately. I will not entertain any disputes later than one week after the grades are posted.

PowerPoint Final Presentation

- a. First, you will need to choose a topic from the text which you are interested in. You will need to send the topic to me via email for approval. Second, you will need to do research on your topic using resources other than your class text. You will need to send me a Literature Review citing at least 4 other sources other than your text. This should be in APA format. Finally, you'll make a PowerPoint presentation on your topic at least 30 slides in length on your approved topic. Assemble a presentation that is interesting, informative, and that generates a good understanding of your topic. Be creative using pictures, color and anything else that you believe will show me that you understand your topic completely. Your grammar and spelling is very important so please use grammar check and spell check. Also, write in APA format on the written portions of your PowerPoint. Produce a quality PowerPoint on your topic that reads like a mini-term paper with an Intro, Topic Sections, Discussion/Conclusion, and Literature Review. Use Bolded Headings for each of these sections of the presentation and for the subtopics you address in the presentation.
- b. The deadline to get your topic approved by me is 11.02.2025. Please send in your topic via email. Your <u>Literature Review</u> should be turned into me <u>via email</u> by 11.09.2025. You should try to be creative in your approach. For example, you may use current events or past news items, popular films, TV shows, the internet, e.g. U-tube or other film clips, other media or data sources, etc. to provide examples of the topic material you are covering.

Presentations are due at any point in the term however, no later than 12.05.2025.

This is so that you may benefit from questions, comments, and discussion on your topic, and so you can continue working on the topic throughout the semester. Please send in via email and I will respond with "Received" once I have received it.

If you have any questions, please do not hesitate to ask. You may email either email address or text the cell number I have provided.
