COURSE INFORMATION

Course Description

This course will provide students with the skills and knowledge to prepare grant proposals (pre-award) and manage awarded grants (post-award). Topics covered include, but are not limited to identifying funding sources, proposal development, budget development, project administration, research compliance, regulatory committees (IRB, IBC, IACUC), and ethics in research practices.

Student Learning Outcomes

1. Students will be able to identify and summarize the stages of the life-cycle of preparing and administering a grant.
2. Students will be able to apply principles of effective grant preparation and administration
