



MGT 308 Entrepreneurship Summer 2026, Section 01W

This course introduces students to the challenges of owning, operating, and marketing a successful small business and the need for entrepreneurial focus in large firms.

CLASS STRUCTURE

MGT 308 is a 100% online course delivered via D2L. The Module To-Do List each week describes required assignments and tasks (e.g., readings, exams, assignments, etc.). Remember to check the MGT 308 D2L site daily for announcements. Online interactions in MGT 308 occur asynchronously. Each course module covers a specific time period, and course requirements must be submitted by the deadline. Regardless of your current time zone location, course due dates are based on Central Time (CT).

- Each module opens and closes at designated times on its appropriate date.
- Within stated open/close times, Module 1 spans five days, and Modules 2-6 span six days.
- Previous modules remain open, but late submissions for prior work are not allowed.

- Students are required to complete the MGT 308 Honor Code to acknowledge specific module start/end dates and other course information.
- Exams are **only open during a designated window**, not the entire module (see Course Schedule for exam open and close times).
- Please be aware that this MGT 308 course may differ in terms of course requirements, grading, and course expectations than other undergraduate courses you have taken.

- Demonstrate an understanding of entrepreneurship concepts and terminology.
- Gain knowledge of business plan components and the business planning process.
- Understand entrepreneurial business strategies.

MEANS OF ASSESSMENT

Class Introduction (10 points)

Students are required to introduce themselves to the class by acknowledging exam dates and sharing educational and professional details. See Course Schedule and D2L for due dates.

Chapter Quizzes (120 points)

Students are required to complete twelve chapter quizzes worth 10 points each. Chapter quizzes consist of 10 questions (true/false, multiple choice) and test knowledge of the material covered in the corresponding chapter(s). Chapter Quizzes are available during the entire period of time when the corresponding module is open. Chapter quizzes are **open book/notes** and **not timed**. **Open book/open notes means that students may utilize a digital version of the textbook or print out their own book chapters and/or notes to use. Students are not allowed to work together or share resources to complete a chapter quiz.**

Chapter quizzes are independent student assignments. **Outside assistance of any kind other than the open book/open notes allowance described above is strictly prohibited.** Additionally, copying or sharing questions in any format is strictly prohibited and will be considered a violation of the ETAMU Student Code of Conduct, MGT 308 Honor Code, and copyright law. Overall class results will be shared for quizzes and exams, but graded tests will not be returned. Quizzes and exams will be reviewed to ensure question quality and overall question performance. See Course Schedule and D2L for quiz dates.

Exams (225 points)

Three exams (Exam 1, Exam 2, Exam 3) are required for this course. These exams are **CLOSED BOOK/CLOSED NOTES** and may contain multiple-choice and true/false questions. Each exam is worth 75 points and assesses student knowledge regarding textbook readings, PPT slides, and audio lectures. Exams are timed; students are allowed a 60-minute window to complete an exam from the time it begins. Please be sure that you have allowed enough time to complete each exam once you start. **Exams**

1, 2, and 3 are proctored using Respondus Monitor, which includes Respondus Lockdown Browser with Webcam Monitoring. Students are required to review the Respondus Monitor Protocols in the Getting Started section and complete the Respondus Monitor Pretest in Module 2 prior to taking the first exam.

All three exams are independent student assignments. **Outside assistance of any kind and copying/sharing questions in any format are strictly prohibited** and will be considered a violation of the ETAMU Student Code of Conduct, MGT 308 Honor Code, and copyright law. Overall class results will be shared for quizzes and exams, but graded tests will not be returned. Quizzes and exams will be reviewed to ensure question quality and overall question performance. **The open and close times listed below for exams may not coincide with the beginning and end of each module.**

Exam 2

- **Note:** Exam 2 covers Chapters 5, 6, 7, and 8. Exam 2 will close on 6/23, 11:00 p.m. CT whether you are finished or not. Make sure to start the exam with ample time to complete it prior to closing.

Exam 3

- Exam Opens in D2L: Monday, June 29, 1 a.m. CT
- Exam Closes in D2L: Thursday, July 2, 11 p.m. CT
- **Note:** Exam 3 covers Chapters 9, 10, 11, and 12. Exam 3 will close on 7/2, 11:00 p.m. CT whether you are finished or not. Make sure to start the exam with ample time to complete it prior to closing.

Entrepreneurship Activities (60 points)

Students are required to complete six activities worth 10 points each. Entrepreneurship activities are available during the period of time that the corresponding module is open. See Course Schedule and D2L for due dates.

Entrepreneurship Videos (35 points)

Students are required to view seven videos (minimum of one per module) and respond to video questions. Module 4 contains two videos. Students must fully watch entrepreneurship videos and answer the video questions through our MGT 308 D2L classroom in order to earn video participation points. Video participation is worth 5 points each. See Course Schedule and D2L for due dates.

Entrepreneurship Readiness Project (50 points)

Students are required to complete an Entrepreneurship Readiness Project (ERP). The ERP consists of two parts with different due dates. For each part, students must complete a self-assessment and analysis.

ERP parts are required to meet the Turnitin threshold of 20% or less. See Course Schedule and D2L for due date.

Copying/sharing information in any format for Entrepreneurship Readiness Project parts is strictly prohibited and will be considered a violation of the ETAMU Student Code of Conduct and MGT 308 Honor Code. ERP guidelines for each part are posted on D2L. See Course Schedule and D2L for due dates.

GRADING FORMAT

Turnitin

MGT 308 will use Turnitin, an originality checker. Entrepreneur Readiness Project parts must meet a 20% or less similarity threshold. Prior to a deadline, students can resubmit their assignment as many times as needed during the week it is due in order to meet the 20% or less threshold. It is the student's responsibility to allow enough time for resubmission of their assignment to Turnitin if their initial report did not meet the 20% or less threshold. An assignment not meeting the 20% or less threshold by the due date/time may earn a zero (no exceptions for procrastination, lack of planning, etc.).
