Course Description: The internship intends to provide students pursuing a career in the health professions exposure to a professional healthcare environment along with interaction with professionals from various fields of healthcare. The student learning experience is faculty supervised and requires journal documentation and a final report.

### COURSE REQUIREMENTS

1. Prepare a work plan. Complete this with the site supervisor. This should include days and hours in which you will observe/work. This needs to be completed within two weeks of the beginning of the semester. Meet with me to get final approval. Your plan should include a minimum of 60 hours for the semester. Failure to achieve this will result in a reduction in your grade. Forms will be given to document your hours.
2. Monthly meetings with me. This will occur in the first week of each month during the semester.
3. A final written report of your experiences during the internship. The paper will need to be between 3-4 pages.
