COURSE DESCRIPTION

This course is a survey of the underlying ideas, principles, and participatory practices of constitutional government in Texas. Topics considered include political culture, ideology, parties, institutions, and demography.

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COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Weekly Discussions: Every week, there will be a discussion forum on D2L on a topic relevant to that week's reading material. Final Exam: During the last week of classes, there will be a cumulative final exam.
