COURSE INFORMATION

Materials – Textbooks and Supplemental Readings: There are no required textbooks for HC 200. However, this course does require utilizing handouts/readings provided in D2L along with ePortfolio access in D2L.

Course Description:

Honors by Design provides a framework for students to proactively explore connections to self, others, and their academic journey. The course launches students into the Honors College by centering one essential question: how do you design a university experience that works for you? Through investigative inquiry and reflective practice, students develop the mindset of an empowered learner – one who approaches honors not as a checklist to complete but as a journey to intentionally shape who they are and will become.

Student Learning Outcomes:

1. Students will reflect on their identity and goals as Honors College students at East Texas A&M University.
2. Establish an ePortfolio that will follow the student through all Honors College courses and graduation.
3. Develop community and university navigation skills, and resources, foundational to a successful first year

COURSE REQUIREMENTS

Minimal Technical Skills Needed

Instructional Methods: This course utilizes in person and online work conducted through D2L/Brightspace. Class consists of presentations, online discussions and writing assignments. Students are expected to engage in the classroom as well as online through discussion posts and group meetings.
