

Foreword

The *Texas A&M Universit*:-*Commerce Statistics Book* is intended to provide a broad array of data, including student enrollment, graduation data, faculty salary and characteristics, etc. It includes tables that contain data relating to University productivity, and presents information pertaining to various assets and resources used by the University.

The basic productivity data are provided for the fall semesters for the last five years. In most instances, these data are available for spring and summer terms for the corresponding years. The information on University resources/assets and library resources are presented for the current fiscal year. Where appropriate, prior year's statistics are also presented.

One major feature of the data presented herein is that they are contained on Microsoft Excel spreadsheets and can be mathematically manipulated. Percentages, pie charts, trend lines, arrays, etc. can readily be developed for these data. Special reports can be prepared with very little effort.

The book has been organized in such manner to permit ready access to basic productivity data by college, department, and academic program. It further provides information pertaining to University resources—the University budget, staffing, facilities, the library, computers, and the University Foundation.

The Department of Institutional Research has noted the appropriate source for each piece of relevant data. These sources are identified in the lower left-hand corner of the table. If there is a more timely, reliable or accurate report available from which more precise or timely data may be obtained, we would appreciate being notified to this effect.

For the most part, we feel that these data are accurate, however, working with reports from the three different information systems may have resulted in considerable problems of which we may not be aware. When comparing our data to other reports, if differences are noted, please bring these to our attention.

For the data pertaining to enrollments and credit hour production, the Coordinating Board Prep System was used to retrieve data; thus the figures may not account for rolling enrollments that occur between and during semesters.

This has truly been a herculean effort of many individuals. The initial credit belongs to Dr. Ed Manton, Head of the Department of General Business and Management Information Systems. He developed the sources of data and the basic format while he was serving on a part-time basis as Director of Institutional Research. The work has continued under leadership of Dennis Brandt, Director of Institutional Research. The final form and updating are the result of the efforts of Allen Christian Jr., Data Analyst. Several graduate assistants also contributed greatly to the effort. As Dean of Institutional Effectiveness, I am indebted to these individuals and extremely pleased with their efforts and contribution.
