

3. BRANCH CAMPUS (continued)

- · Each independence criterion must be met
- Caveat: Use "Branch" in a site title if and only if it's approved as a branch
- Sites can be called
 - Campus
 - Center
 - Facility
 - Laboratory
 - Site
 - etc.

4. WHAT TO INCLUDE IN NOTIFICATIONS

- Site name
- · Physical address
- Implementation date
- Percentage of initial program(s) to be offered at the site

 - Page 28: For a <u>NEW OFF-CAMPUS SITE OR BRANCHCAMPUS</u> provide the following information...

Common omissions / reasons for deferral:

- Evidence of legal or other authority
- Curriculum
- Course descriptions
- Faculty Roster with all courses assigned to at least one faculty member
- Evidence of adequate library + learning resources and accessibility

6. SITE RELOCATIONS AND ADDRESS CHANGES

- Simple, administrative matter but essential to be kept complete and up-to-date
- A move is a relocation if the new site will serve the same pool of students
 - All or nothing: cannot relocate and continue at the same location

7. SITE CLOSURES

- All site closures require a teach-out plan and approval
- The Commission approves the closure process, not the closure per se
- The institution is obligated to submit the teach-out plan as soon as the decision is made to close
- A site is considered closed when the institution stops admitting, not the last term of instruction

- "Procedure Three" lists all necessary information to be provided in a closure request
- Commission requirements must be reconciled with institutional, system, or state processes and terminology
 No provisions for "suspended,"
- No provisions for "suspended,"
 "abeyance," "discontinued," or other statuses: either open or closed, but....

Closed sites may be re-opened within five years with a simple letter of notification

8. SPECIAL CASES

- First three off-campus sites to be approved must be visited
- All international sites are visited without exception
- When a site is approved, it's approved: you may add additional approved programs or courses with no further action

8. SPECIAL CASES (continued)

- Initiating a new site for a program already offered at 3 or more off-campus site may qualify for a modified prospectus
 Military contracts
 Dual enrollment
 The Substantive Change Standard (14.2) in the *Principle* and expectations of compliance
