Texas A&M University-Commerce may not endorse, recommend, or otherwise indicate political support for any candidate for an elected office, or for any current officeholder of such an office. The university will not discriminate against any organization or individual on the basis of political affiliation or doctrine, nor will it favor any political organization or doctrine over another.

Faculty groups that are recognized by the university and meet on campus may invite candidates for political office or current officeholders to speak at the group's meeting. These groups are responsible for informing campus officials about the events to ensure the officeholders are afforded all due respect and courtesies to which their office is entitled. Faculty members working with student groups on campus must be aware that student organizations officially chartered and currently registered with the university Office of Student Engagement must also follow the above guidelines. The university prohibits use of any of its symbols, insignia, or other identifying marks in association with any partisan political activities.
