Communications from Senate President Crenshaw	Dr. Crenshaw reported that President McFarland will check with the A&M system attorneys about the wording of our current anti-discrimination policy as it appears on job applications.  Several proposals Senate sent forward last academic year are still pending. President McFarland will review the Senate recommendation to change the annual evaluation process from a calendar year to an academic year.  A new ruling was issued from the Attorney General of the State of Texas concerning what is included as open records at the university. Annual evaluations of all university employees now fall in this category because of our public institution status and the freedom of information act.	
Committee Reports	Academic Life: Senator John Smith's committee submitted a recommendation to revise the University's Mission Statement as it appears on job applications to include sexual orientation.  Academic Practices: Senator Linda Openshaw has received 100 responses to her committee's Class Schedule Survey. Final analysis will be presented at the February Senate meeting.	Moved by John Smith. Portfolio paperwork submitted will be housed in the library for ease of access to committee members.  Organization of the Senate: Senator David Rankin's committee recommended placing the Faculty Lounge under the auspices of the University Facilities & Scheduling committee.
