<p><b>Invited Speakers:</b></p> <p><b>Dr. John Humphreys, Provost &amp; Vice President for Academic Affairs</b></p>	<p>April 3, 2018, Senate minutes were approved with minor modifications</p> <p>The meeting opened at 2:02 p.m. President King introduced the first invited speaker, Dr. John Humphreys.</p> <p>Dr. Humphreys shared the following information with the faculty senators:</p> <p><b>Topic: Tenure &amp; Promotion (T&amp;P)</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Conversation on T&amp;P is needed</li> <li>• Cannot measure ‘substantial’.</li> <li>• Department T&amp;P guidelines are important</li> <li>• Senators are invited to jointly work with the Provost Office on T&amp;P guidelines</li> <li>• Faculty senate should be more engaged in governance.</li> </ul> <p>Dr. Humphreys asked the faculty senate to weigh in directly in the writing of the T&amp;P Policy</p> <p><b>Topic: Finances</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• According to the Chronicle, colleges and departments are closing</li> <li>• Need a programmatic budget review</li> <li>• Faculty merit pool for 2018 will be 2% (i.e., contingent on enrollment)</li> <li>• Student enrollment (Graduate and International) down 500 students</li> </ul>	<p>President King stated that the minutes were approved as amended</p>

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Formula-driven enrollment funding</li> <li>• Faculty lines have increased (20-23)</li> <li>• Approved \$2,000 for all faculty members who requested travel for professional development</li> <li>• Budgeting – band needed new uniforms. It will cost \$122,000 to get the number of instruments that are needed</li> </ul> <p><b>Topic: Workload Policy and Equity Plan:</b></p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• University Workload committee has been established to address issues of salary, equity, and workload</li> <li>• Need to get faculty senators involved in developing evaluation criteria for program assessment</li> <li>• Gender equity issues also need to be addressed</li> </ul> <p>President King asked Dr. Humphreys the question below:  President Keck has been approved to receive a paid sabbatical leave next academic school year. How does the president qualify for a paid sabbatical?</p> <p>Dr. Humphreys’ response: State rule allows a president who is retiring to take a paid sabbatical leave contingent upon a certain number of years served as president. The person has to return to the university as faculty after the one-year leave. President Keck’s last day is August 31<sup>st</sup>.</p> <p><b>Topic: Final Exam during final weeks:</b> Faculty members must administer final exams for students during the scheduled finals’ week (i.e., particularly undergraduate students). This directive is from Dr. Keck.</p>	
<p><b>Invited Speaker  William Kuracina,  Interim Dean of  College of  Humanities, Social  Sciences, and arts</b></p>	<p>Dr. Kuracina, Chair of the University Faculty Academic Workload Committee, shared the following information:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Priority- salaries and workload. Goal is 3:3. The question, “How do we get there?”</li> <li>• The broader definition of workload consists of three components – Teaching load, Research/Scholarly Activities, and Service</li> <li>• A&amp;M Commerce does not differentiate by faculty position types (tenure-track vs. professional-track)</li> </ul>	
<p><b>Invited Speaker  Tim Murphy,  Chief Information  Officer</b></p>	<p>Mr. Murphy discussed what’s coming up next year:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Software updates</li> <li>• Will check web sites for misspelled words, broken links, etc.</li> <li>• Adobe suite license purchased for the university</li> </ul>	

	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Software governance board</li> <li>• Site license for Office 360 (tamuc.edu)</li> </ul>	
<b>Communications</b>	<p>President King shared the following information with the senators:</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• Dr. Newsom is the new Dean of Students</li> <li>• New Development Office</li> <li>• Workday- one-time exception for summer hires. This will be one day in May</li> <li>• Workday- we are now expected to log in to Workday and approve annual evaluations.</li> </ul>	
<b>Committee Reports</b>	<ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Academic Life:</b> Senator Larkin did not have a report</li> <li>• <b>Academic Practice:</b> Senator Ballenger informed the senators of a new task assigned to this committee. Dr. Ricky Dobbs assigned the committee this task: “Establish guidelines for the use of the D2L gradebook in all undergraduate courses. The purpose would be to enable grade checks and interventions to be done by the various entities that currently request that info directly from faculty.</li> </ul> <p>What is envisioned is a system that allows appropriate offices to have view only access to student grades and then conduct grade interventions to turn students around. This would reduce greatly the current reporting requests going to faculty, and allow for more tailored and effective interventions.”</p> <ul style="list-style-type: none"> <li>• <b>Admission and Retention:</b> Senator Kelly did not have a report</li> <li>• <b>Curriculum:</b> Senator Pierce did not have a report</li> <li>• <b>Budget:</b> Senator Starnes did not have a report</li> <li>• <b>Faculty Senate Awards:</b> Senator May stated that the faculty awards are done</li> <li>• <b>Organization of the Senate:</b> No report</li> </ul>
