- 9. News update: about to contract with a marketing communications firm whose first task will be to overhaul our web site.
- 10. UCD enrollment low but getting better. 109% last fall's final enrollment we need predictable schedules and course rotation.
- 11. Senator Heslop asked about improving the placement and number of white boards in a classroom. President Jones said it would not be a difficult problem to solve.

Robert Dotson, Assistant Dean of Campus Life & Student Development Robert Dotson reported on the work of the Academic Practices Committee chaired by Dr. Ballenger.

1. Dean Dotson gave the Senators a Civility statement. It will be updated in the student guidebook and will be added to undergraduate policy. The statement is available on the Judicial Affairs web page:

- 2. Because there is a need to come up with a better system of documenting and tracking classroom incidents- Dean Dotson provided a proposed Incident flow chart.
- Incident reports are currently handled by faculty and department heads at both the graduate and undergraduate level. This policy should be reviewed and the decision should be voted on. An incident report form was provided.
- 4. Guidebook goes live the first day of school. Policy needs to be decided by August 1.
- 5. The civility statement from the Dean of Students' office and the Academic Practices committee of the Senate on academic dishonesty will be worked on and sent to department heads.
- 6. Any questions to clarify civility statement, flow chart, and incident report should be sent to Robert Dotson.
