The Senate amended the Annual Faculty Evaluation Procedures to include the following statement:

"The department head and dean will make sure that their annual evaluations of each faculty member are based on the same objective criteria used to determine tenure, promotion, and post-tenure reviews. It should be realized that inflated merit ratings, assigned arbitrarily, may become inconsistent when faculty members are later evaluated for tenure, promotion, and post-tenure reviews."

Academic Practices: Senator Linda Openshaw submitted her committee's report summarizing the survey results of the university classroom disruption issue. The following six recommendations were made:

- 1. A student conduct template for all course syllabi.
- 2. A list of unacceptable behaviors to be included in all course syllabi.
- 3. University student handbook rewritten to address appropriate student conduct.
- 4. University student handbook needs to be updated to include a list of inappropriate classroom behaviors.
- 5. Consistent behavior guidelines applied across the campus.
- 6. Stronger sanctions taken against student disruptions.

Admission & Retention: Senator John Smith submitted this committee's recommendations for admission and retention at TAMU-Commerce. A motion was made to table these recommendations for further study.
