

Minutes: CoSEA Leadership Meeting
Wednesday, February 6, 2013

1) SACS Update (Edelman, Palmer, Peer): Dr. Peer introduced Dr. Marila Palmer, the new Associate Provost for Institutional Effectiveness and Planning. Dr. Peer provided a SACS update and spoke about the importance of ensuring that all necessary documentation is in place in the Provost's office to back up faculty teaching qualifications. (SACS Core Requirement 3.7.1, Faculty Credentials)

2) Research infrastructure and instrumentation support (Lemanski): Discussion about the need to support the university's research infrastructure/instrumentation and funding possibilities for a technician to maintain instrumentation in the Science building, e.g., instructional enhancement, grants. Grady will investigate using IE funds to support this strategic requirement for student learning.

3) Departmental T&P Guidelines (Sirakov): Dr. Nikolay Sirakov is currently working on the Tenure and Promotion guidelines for the college and will be meeting with the T&P committee members to discuss departmental criteria. He needs all of the individual departments to provide his college committee with copies of their T&P guidelines. These need to be forwarded to Nikolay now.

11) Follow-up comments on data-driven annual evaluations:

Student evaluations are one (or all) of the data available. If a faculty member ONLY has student evaluations then those will be the entire data source for evaluating teaching effectiveness. But there are many other options of data they can (and should) include:

- +Student Learning Outcomes
- +Contribution to programmatic goals
- +In-class visits and peer assessment
- +Teaching awards and external recognition
- +Check the written commentaries carefully. Negative ≠ Bad
