As an Agricultural Science teacher, I taught grades 7-8th at the junior high level. Specific courses I taught were Principles of Agriculture, Equine Science, and Small Animal Science. In this position, I oversaw all three parts of the ag education model, classroom instruction, SAE's, and FFA and ensured all parts were represented within my classroom. Although I only taught one year, I was able to boost the junior high's involvement within the whole agricultural program through training multiple LDE and CDE teams, hauling students to Greenhand Camp and District/Area Convention, hosting monthly FFA meetings, and introducing county livestock projects to parents/students. Although I worked primarily on the junior high campus, I did perform other "ag teacher duties" outside of this campus such as, hauling livestock kids to various jackpot Saturday shows, Houston Livestock Show and Rodeo, Waco Fair and Rodeo, and Dixie Nationals in Jackson, MS. I also judged several LDE contests in the fall, helped facilitate two Floral Cup Competitions, and helped facilitate the Four States Livestock Show.

East Texas A&M University (ETAMU)

Assistant Director of Stewardship and Donor Relations/2024-2025

In my current position, I oversee the stewardship efforts for the Division of Philanthropy and Engagement while developing and maintaining strong connections with our university donors. I steward donors through various touchpoints and am in charge of creating/designing impact reports, endowment/financial reports for roughly 525 endowed donor funds, mailing scholarship recipient thank you letters, hosting small and large scale donor recognition events, and ensuring donors are satisfied with how their funds are being utilized. I work closely on a daily basis with internal campus partners to ensure donor intent has been met when awarding funds and that funds are being spent instead of laying dormant. I also collaborate with external partners on projects such as event coordination and with our local print shop on designing, printing, and mailing on a large scale capacity. I use various software applications such as Adobe Suite, Microsoft Office, Canopy, Raiser's Edge/NXT, and Banner. Managing a budget and staying within my limits regarding my funding is another skill I have obtained through working in this position. I have a set budget I must stay under that supports all of the projects I fulfill throughout the fiscal year, and I do so through strategic segmentation of donor populations and strategically curated touchpoints.

I worked as a part-time Grad Assistant at East Texas A&M. My duties varied between research and assisting the college with tasks such as media relations, event planning and educational activities. Key initiatives I helped facilitate were the Texas Area V and VI FFA CDE Contest, hosted by the university. In preparing for this event, I aided in printing and stuffing information packets for the students and teachers, printing rules and information sheets from Texas FFA for the judge panels and assisted with awards inventory months prior. During the event, I helped coordinate contest result retrieval from judge panels, passed out awards to respective schools, and announced results during the awards banquet. As a Grad Assistant, I also remained engaged with the CASNR Alumni Newsletter team, mentoring and guiding the student editors in teaching them Associated Press guidelines.

As a substitute teacher, I managed classrooms of up to 30 students and followed the proper CTE course curriculum as set by the Agricultural Teacher. The classes I covered were from 8th grade to 12th grade and the specific classes I oversaw were, 'Principles of Agriculture' (8th grade), 'Small Animal Management,' 'Equine Science,' 'Livestock Production,' 'Vet Med Applications,' and 'Advanced Animal Science.' Working in these specific classes allowed me to practice in real time the

knowledge I gained in my undergraduate studies regarding agriculture education. I was able to implement the TEKS as they aligned with Chapter 130. SubChapter A. Along with this, I was able to reflect on some student learning theories, presented by Piaget and Vygotsky, of children actively learning from the world around them, whether it be through hands on experience or learning through human interaction.
