Abstract

On May 18, 2018, a shooter entered Santa Fe High School, killing eight students and two teachers. Using ethnographic methods, this research examines the role of faith, rituals, language, and symbols in the trauma-affected community during the response, recovery, and resiliency efforts as perceived by the Santa Fe community and those impacted by the tragedy. Qualitative data collected from 100 individuals ages 17-84 illustrated how historical trauma, community culture, and faith-based organizations impact community resiliency and how illusions of a homogenous view of the community left many feeling shocked, divided, forgotten, or muted. (205 pages, 2 tables, 15 figures, 8 appendices, 91 reference titles.)

Bruce Therapeutic Garden, Keep Santa Fe Beautiful*) 2018 – 2022 Evidence-based research provided innovative insight into transforming an underutilized City pocket park into an inclusive and therapeutic restorative garden to help the community of Santa Fe heal after the May 18, 2018, school shooting. As a result, I began logistical planning with a landscape architect, land surveyor, civil engineer, city officials, and local community members to design and construct the quarter-million-dollar transformation project through strong partnerships. In addition, I created and shared presentations of the project with numerous local, civic, and area organizations. In the first year and a half, the organization received donations of more than \$185,000 of in-kind services and volunteer hours. The project is near the end of stage three (a protective bollard fence) and is due to be finished by May 2024.

Facilitator (Coalition of Non-Profits, Santa Fe Community, Independent project) 2019 – 2020 Invited the non-profit groups operating to assist the community of Santa Fe, TX, to meet monthly to exchange information and ideas. Organized with the goal that a coalition in a lower socio-economic rural residential area would be better served collectively to limit strains on local resources and external funds, assisting a higher number of residents. The multi-faceted partnership sought to improve the quality of life in Santa Fe by offering various options while working together and supporting each other's missions.

Facilitator & Teen Support Specialist (Solace Retreat, City of Santa Fe Resiliency Center) 2019 Fostered growth and healing amongst nearly a dozen teenagers profoundly impacted by the May 18, 2018, school shooting through a six-day retreat to a remote location to engage in nature-based therapy and peer bonding. Students then take a 2-hour kayaking tour of Greens Bayou with equipment and paddling instruction provided by Bayou City Adventures. The tour features an up-close look at a bald eagle's nest and an opportunity to see native waterfowl and other wildlife. During the kayaking session, students will be given a water quality testing demonstration and a discussion about the importance of water quality to the overall health of a community.
