Course Descriptions

COUN 5313 Group Counseling Methods - Instructor of Record - Dallas Baptist University

Three semester hours. An experiential study of group counseling theories and techniques. Leadership roles, stages of group development, and member responsibilities are explored. Ethical and legal issues related to group interventions are discussed. Open only to students in the Master of Arts in Professional Counseling, Master of Education in School Counseling, and the accelerated B.A./B.S. in Psychology/M.A. in Professional Counseling Programs.

COUN 501 Introduction to the Counseling Profession – Guest Lecturer - Texas A&M-Commerce

Three semester hours. Recommended as initial course in a student's program to serve as an introduction to the counseling profession. Roles of counselors and related professionals in various settings are presented. Professional goals and objectives, trends, professional associations, ethical and legal issues, history, credentials, and preparation standards for counselors are explored.

COUN 512 Career Development-Online Lecturer/Co-Teach - Texas A&M-Commerce

Three semester hours. Interrelationships among lifestyle, work place, and career planning are explored. Career development theories; occupational, educational, and personal/social information sources and delivery systems; and organization of career development programs are studied.

COUN 516 Basic Counseling Skills – Adjunct Professor – Texas A&M-Commerce

Three semester hours. Provides the foundation for all practicum and internship experiences. Students learn communication and interpersonal skills under faculty supervision. Demonstration of these skills is a prerequisite for enrollment in practicum (<u>COUN 551</u>). Students will examine their intrapersonal issues and interpersonal styles and will follow ACA Ethical Standards.

COUN 528 Introduction to Group Dynamics and Procedure - Co-Teach - Texas A&M-Commerce

Three semester hours. A study of group development, dynamics, and theories in relation to group counseling. Leadership styles, techniques and roles are explored, and ethical issues related to group interventions are discussed. Prerequisites: Pass Level 1 Examination.

COUN 301 Orientation to the Counseling Profession-Instructor of Record - Texas A&M-Commerce

Three semester hours. A study of general professional issues including ethics, history, credentialing, professional associations, and roles of counselors in various settings.

COUN 409 Group Leadership-Instructor of Record - Texas A&M-Commerce

Three semester hours. This course will focus on the literature on groups, group dynamics and leadership. The class will also offer personal experiences in individual growth through group participation.

COUN 410 Introduction to Counseling Theory and Methods-Instructor of Record - Texas A&M-Commerce

Three semester hours. This course provides a general overview of counseling theories, an introduction to counseling techniques, the conditions which facilitate an effective counseling relationship, and stages in the counseling process.

COUN 412 Career Development-Instructor of Record - Texas A&M-Commerce

Three semester hours. A study of the impact of career services as an instrument of human development and mental health. Emphasis on history of career guidance, contemporary shifts on social values in and the meaning of work, changes in the occupational structure, and work and mental health in today's society.

COUN 414 Home and Family Loving-Instructor or Record - Texas A&M-Commerce

Three semester hours. Functional study of modern family with special attention to roles, marriage preparation and partner selection. Emphasis on marital adjustment and other essentials of successful home and family life. Examination of current, relative issues of human relations including family planning, sex education, divorce, communications, and marriages under special circumstances.
