Prior research suggests that client information that is not directly relevant to auditor decisionmaking distracts less experienced auditors and lowers their performance (Shelton 1999). Alternatively, high time pressure conditions help to refocus auditor attention toward more relevant client information, thus improving auditor performance (Glover 1997). Unlike the beneficial effects of high time pressure, this study proposes that workload pressure will decrease auditor performance and that GAAS guidance reminders can be used to counteract this unwanted effect.
