I co-taught and taught Composition and Technical Communication courses under the supervision of the Center of Teaching Excellence and the Department of Language, Literature, and Writing from 2021 to 2024. These courses are designed for first-year students to introduce them to the various dynamics of literacy and its effectiveness in the academic world and beyond. Besides teaching traditional writing and rhetorical practices, I integrate game designing, design thinking, and platforming to teach writing to students transitioning into academia and for jobs.

I taught an independent General Education and Humanities Lit course (in-person) during the fall of 2023. This multi-genre and multimodal course, focusing on environmental writing, introduced students to the application of literature in understanding how culture shapes ecological violence, fosters a sustainable future in fiction, and promotes social justice. They read a variety of traditional and non-traditional texts, including anime, video games, websites, and social science texts, to collaboratively think, write, and advocate for sustainability.

I taught courses on English for Second Language Speakers for two semesters to international students from Mexico, Japan, and Africa. Students read and wrote about American culture, social practices, and literacy practices, including speaking, reading, and writing, through diverse traditional and nontraditional historical, political, and cultural texts to produce diverse assignments.
