



International Student Statement of Finances and Sponsor Statement Graduate Student

Below is the estimated cost of study for one year at A&M-Commerce for a graduate F-1 or J-1 international student. Please note this is an *estimate* of expenses for one year of study and students may pay an amount other than what is listed below based on the number of hours enrolled, housing options, and academic major. Students are required to provide proof of funding for one year of study at A&M-Commerce before they may receive an I-20 from A&M-Commerce.

REQUIRED DOCUMENTS FOR FUNDING:

- Bank account (checking, saving, CD's):
 - Should be dated **within six (6) months** from **first day of semester admitted**.
 - Should be official and clearly identify account holder's name, type of account, bank name and branch
 - Should contain the specific amount of money available (***statements with non-liquid assets, property, credit card, bonds, stocks, retirement account are not acceptable***)
 - Originals may be requested at A&M-Commerce's discretion
- University funds
 - The main types of funding that a student may receive will be [assistantships, fellowships](#) (graduate students) or [scholarships](#). Please go to www.tamuc.edu/scholarships for more information. If you have been offered an scholarship, assistantship (GA), or fellowship by A&M-Commerce then you may use that award toward the funding requirement for your I-20 or DS-2019. If your award does not cover the required amount you will be required to show additional funding from another source to cover the balance.
- Government funds:
 - The I-20 cannot be issued until a financial guarantee with the student's name, university name, and academic major student is admitted has been provided.
- Sponsor living in the U.S.
 - Sponsors living in the U.S. will be required to submit the [I-134 Affidavit of Support](#) in place of the sponsor statement below. ***Sponsors will only need to include the funding information they are submitting to the university on the I-134 (not salary, tax forms, real estate, etc...).***
